VISIT TO GO CHEESE FACTORY TO MANCHER, PUNE

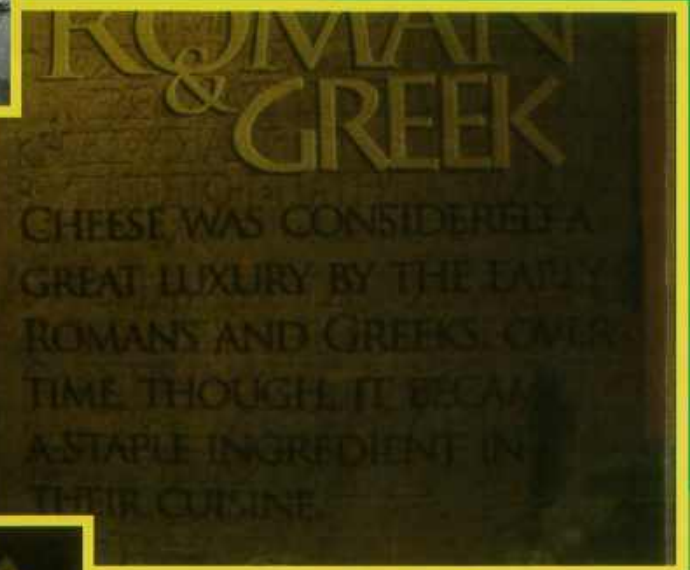
