Dear Parents, Guardians, Students & Members of Staff,

A very Good Evening to you all.

It is my pleasure to welcome you to the 91st Annual Prize Day Ceremony of Barnes School & Junior College. I take this opportunity to express our honour at having amongst us this evening, General Neville Foley who is a Director of the Bombay Education Society, the Management of Barnes School & Junior College.

General Foley commenced his training in the Indian Military Academy, Dehra Dun, in January 1956. After being commissioned into the Armoured Corps, he served as a Mechanised Officer and retired on 30th September 1994, as the Director General, Mechanised Forces of the Army, following a hugely successful career.

His qualifications include "National Defence Management," USA and an MSc in Defence Studies from Chennai University. Instrumental in developing and training two of the largest Cantonments of the Army in Ahmednagar, he leads an active retired life with his wife, Caroline and has four sons, all comfortably settled in life.

In addition to being nominated to the 12th Lok Sabha to represent the Anglo Indian Community, General Foley is presently the Director of Foley Designs Private Ltd. His wide array of interests include a special interest in oil painting, travelling, reading, writing and collecting artefacts, besides being an active Environmentalist, a Wildlife Photographer and a Naturalist.

We are equally privileged to have Dr. Prashant Patil as our Chief Guest, along with his wife, Dr. (Mrs.) Soniya Patil. An Orthopaedic Surgeon and an alumnus of Barnes School, Dr. Prashant Patil is a Consultant and Director at Suyash Hospital, Nasik. He is a dedicated researcher in orthopaedic subjects and is the initiator of NAME, The Nasik Accident and Medical Emergency Foundation, which has set up an ambulance service in the city of Nasik, absolutely free of cost.

Dr. Patil is well-known for his eye camps in tribal areas of Satana where free eye check-ups are conducted and patients are provided with free food and medicine during the period of their treatment. He has also worked with mentally challenged children and played a major part in the management of trauma centers during the 1992 communal riots in Mumbai, as well as during the 1993 serial bomb blasts in Mumbai.



Awarded the Girna Gaurav Puraskar for exemplary work in orthopaedic profession and social work, he is also the winner of the Lokmat Icon Award for outstanding work in emergency trauma care and free ambulance service in emergencies.

Thank you Dr. Prashant Patil, Mrs. Soniya Patil and General Neville Foley for accepting our invitation to give away the prizes and encourage the students to work hard towards shaping a bright future and going on to become an Alumnus who makes Barnes proud.

The 91st Annual Prize Day follows close on the heels of the Senior School Prefects' Investiture Ceremony where we nominated students to take up the roles of leaders as the Head Boy, Head Girl, Captains, and Prefects. These two events following in quick succession have made us realize how the expectations from those chosen to lead and the prize winners of this evening are closely knit and delicately interwoven.

What do we expect from the leaders we chose just a week ago and the prize winners for this year? Or, for that matter, every year. Was the oath taken by the appointed leaders more meaningful than mere words and empty promises? Similarly, do the prizes or tokens of appreciation given away to students for exceptional performance in academics, sports or exemplary behaviour hold deeper significance than meets the eye? They certainly do.

As our students move ahead in life, these oaths and prizes are meant to act as reminders of the responsibility that they carry on their shoulders. A responsibility towards each other. A responsibility to create more than they consume. A responsibility to build things that would outlast them. A responsibility to find their own limits and push through them.

On their journey through life, they are sure to have days that would frustrate and discourage and irritate them. They would encounter moments that would knock them off their game, diminish their confidence and self-belief. That's just part of the leadership and life ride that they and we are privileged to be on. Part of being a human being.

There would be moments when, in spite of displaying unique heroism, they fail to get recognition or rewards, or even face criticism or opposition. Those would be the times when the oath that they had taken as a leader in school or the book that they had received as a recognition of their talents prove to be a source of inspiration and encourage them to hunt for opportunity amid adversity and make them realize that what makes the best the best is not how they perform when all is going well, but how masterfully they show up when everything is falling apart.

It gives me great pleasure to state that during the year gone by our Class 10 and 12 students performed exceptionally well in spite of the difficult circumstances and challenges that the school has been facing. A comparison of the number of students scoring in the 90s showed a steady increase for the Class 10 students since the past five years and a similar rise in the number of students scoring in the 80s for Class 12.

The Boys' Football Team crafted a masterful performance to bring us the prized Maharashtra Anglo Indian Football Trophy by beating The Bishop's School, Camp, Pune, in Pune. Although they did not meet with the same success while participating in the Steven Anderson Memorial Tournament at Christ Church School, Mumbai, as they lost to the host team in the finals, the display of talent during the tournament and the Athletic & Debates Olympiad at The Bishop's School, Pune, as well as during the Alfresco Inter School Cultural Fest, Allahabad, was heartwarming.

The Education World ranking of Barnes School & Junior College as the No. 1 Day-cum-Boarding School in Nasik and Maharashtra for the second consecutive year, followed by the Education Today ranking of No. 7 in Maharashtra and No. 13 in India for exemplary contributions to the Education Field was a shot in the arm and proved that we are headed in the right direction, with the right intentions.

The introduction of Cambridge English Language Assessments, the training that our staff underwent to prepare for the Assessments and pass those intricacies of the English Language to our students, in addition to workshops attended by our staff dealing with 'Making Schools Safer and Smarter', 'Seminar on Childhood Depression' and 'Law on Workplace Sexual Harassment Demystified', a Career Counselling Session for Class 12 students and the Mindsprings Teacher Training Programmes were notable moments and high points of the Academic Year gone by.

The internal school events, in the likes of the English and Hindi Elocutions, the Singing Competition, the Spelling and Quiz Competitions, the Annual Athletic Meet, the Chess Competition, the Variety Entertainment Programme, and the Nativity Play were interspersed with visits from The Bishop's School, Camp, Pune, boys' football and girls' basketball teams and The Boys' High School, Allahabad, football and basketball teams. Our boys' football team and the girls' basketball team then returned the favour as they travelled to Pune for a friendly fixture with the teams from The Bishop's School, Kalyaninagar, Pune.

The celebration of the Birth Anniversary of our Late President, Dr. A. P. J. Kalam on Thursday, 15th October 2015, as "School Without Bag Day" and "Reading Inspiration Day" was carried out from Classes 5 to 8, as were the celebrations for "Constitution Day" on 26th November 2015 and the "Swachh Bharat Pledge" initiated by the Honourable Prime Minister, Mr. Narendra Modi.

The T-10 Cricket Tournament held as a part of the Founder's Day celebrations on 29th January 2016, involving the students and Members of Staff, was every bit as exciting and entertaining as the Inter House Cricket Tournament and the Inter House Football Tournament.

Our students made us proud by securing top positions in the Elocution Competition held at Smt. Rangubai Junnare English Medium High School, Nasik, and performing pretty decently during the Rasbihari Music Awards in February 2016.

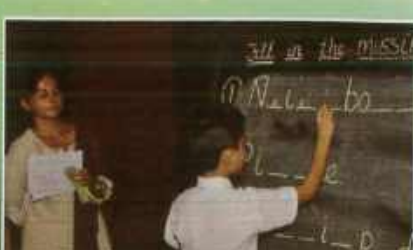
The Junior School SPELLING COMPETITION 2015

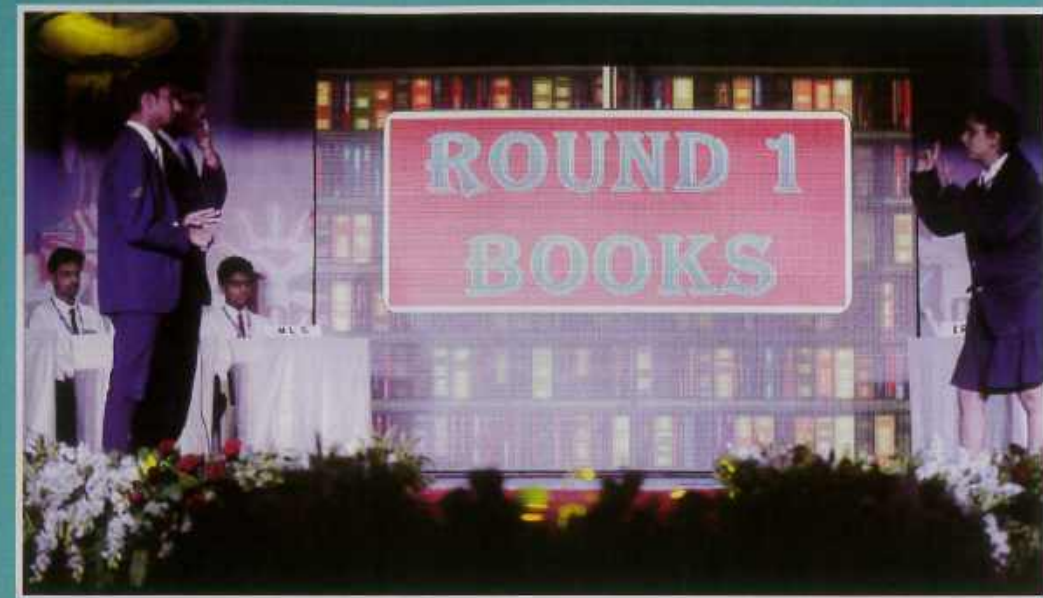

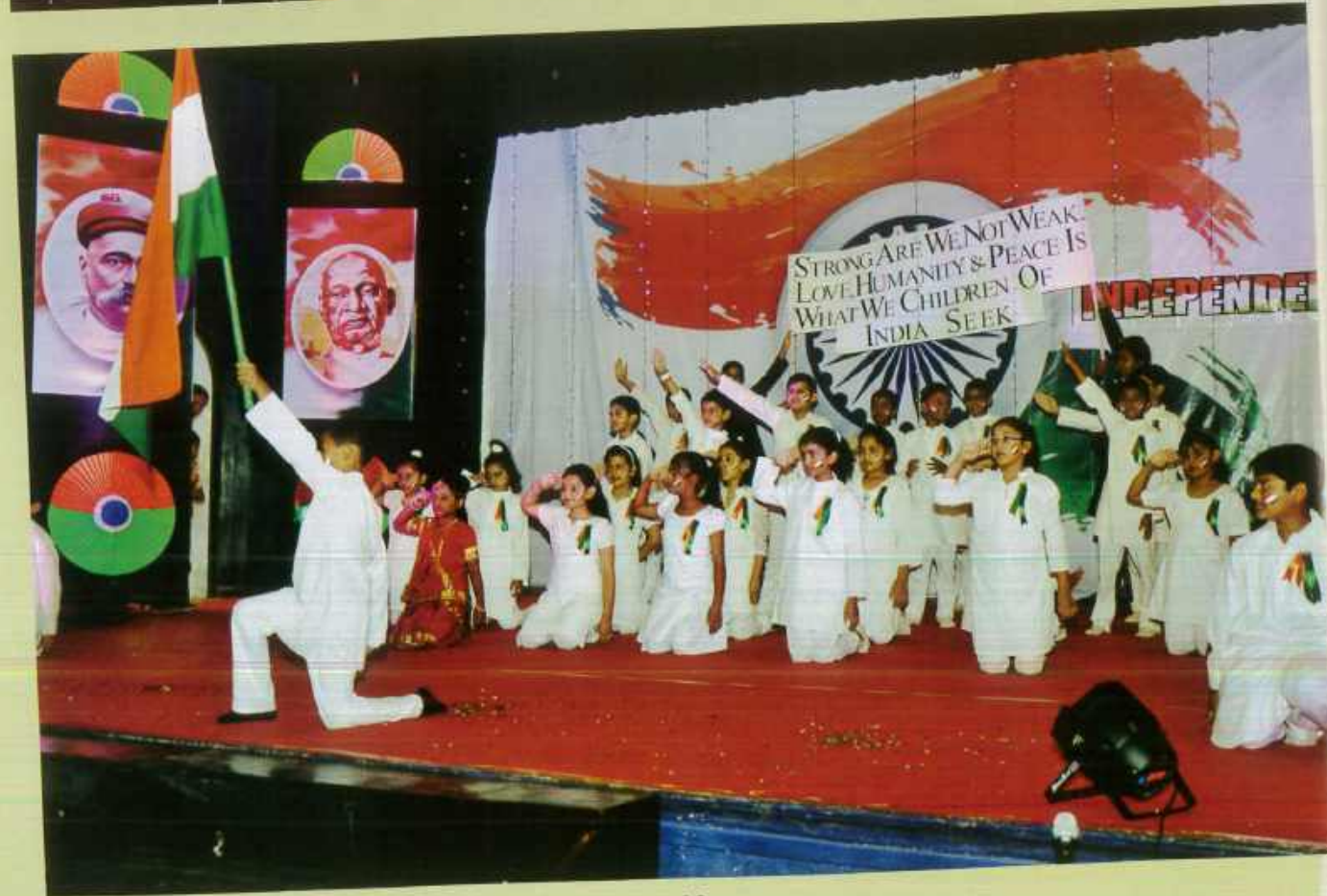

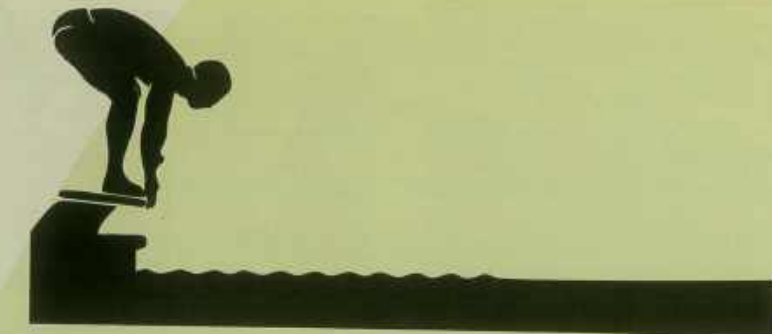












SWIMMING

Jessica Lobo broke the five previous records in the senior category and set a new record. Arya Kodre, senior category, broke one record and set a new record.

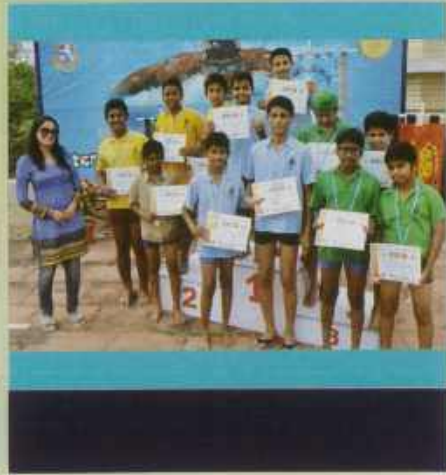
