Now the school report. I know the Annual report is not a very welcome interlude. I have tried to trim it.

We all know, presentation of the school report on its Annual Day is an enduring tradition to take time to pause, turn around to look at the fruitful year gone by, achieving both the expected and unexpected, while setting various milestones and then synergizing ourselves to move ahead to face the challenges in the coming year, with a positive attitude.

Academic performance

I start with the academic results. Barnes focuses on the holistic development of every student but at the same time we ensure that the academic training takes the centre stage in our system and our results do showcase this fact. Here are the Board results:-

Class X : 88 students appeared. All students passed.

Tanvi Bhoge topped the Class 10 examinations with 96% followed by Akshay Kumar Jha with 94% and Karen Kumar in the 3rd position with 93.67%. While Tanvi scored above 90 in 05 of her subjects, Akshay and Karen scored 100 out of 100 in Mathematics.

Class XII : 57 students appeared, 56 students passed, while 01 failed to achieve the pass grade.

Top score (Science): Giwil Gidwani, with 86.60%, along with 100 out of 100 in Computer Science

Top score (Commerce) : Gurmeet Sethi with 83.30%

Our heartiest congratulations to these students who have made the school proud.

Education Today invited us to The Lalit Hotel, Mumbai, on 9th September 2017 to honour the school on completion of 92 glorious years in education. For the fourth consecutive year Barnes emerged as Maharashtra's Number 1 Day-cum-Boarding

School as per the survey published by Education World, the Human Development Magazine. This is a matter of pride for Barnes School. We are determined to move to the higher rungs of the podium in the coming years.

The glamorous School Rankings Awards Ceremony for 2017-18 was held on 22nd & 23rd September, 2017 at the Leela Ambience Gurgaon Hotel & Residences, Haryana.

Inter-school Cultural Competitions

Apart from various intra-school competitions that are scheduled on regular basis such as debates, elocution and many sporting activities, students of our school are encouraged to participate in various inter school competitions. The aim is to help students understand their strengths and identify what skills they need to improve to negotiate in a not-so-easy world. Our students participated in the prestigious Albert Barrow Memorial All-India Inter-School Creative Writing Competition, 2017.

19 students from our school participated in the Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam Inter School Astronomy Quiz which was organized by the Khagol Mandal, an amateur astronomers group in Nasik that aims to create awareness about astronomy. 3 of our students: Aditya Kumar, Bhaskar Kapse and Tejas Kulkarni topped the first round and qualified for the final round held on 8th. 55 students from our school participated in Alfresco; an Inter Institutional Cultural and Games Extravaganza, organized by the Boys' High School, Allahabad held between 28th October to 2nd November, 2017. Our students secured many prizes. The Cantonment Board, Devlali, with an aim to promote a "Clean and Green Devlali", organized a State Open Rapid Chess Tournament on Saturday 27th January, 2018. Eleven of our students, registered for the Under 10, Under 12 and Under 14 categories, held at the Combined Primary School, Cantonment Board, Devlali.

ACCOMPLISHMENT IN SPORTS

Barnes organized the 3rd Invitational Inter School Boys' Football & Girls' Basketball Tournament between 17th & 18th July, 2017.

Barnes beat Sharad Pawar International School in the finals and Manmath Bhujbal of our School was awarded the Top Scorer of the tournament. In the Girls' Basketball Tournament, Barnes lost to Xavier's in the Semi Finals. The All Maharashtra Anglo-Indian CISCE Football & Basketball Tournament was held in Barnes in the month of August 2017 over a period of 10 days. The winners of the Football Tournament were The Bishop's School, Camp, Pune. The runners up were Cathedral and John Connors School, Mumbai. Barnes placed 3rd Adnan Mirza of Barnes School was awarded the highest scorer of the tournament.

Barnes School won the Alfresco Inter-School football tournament at Boys High School, Allahabad for the fifth consecutive year.

One of our students, Krish Kadiwala represented Indian Football Team in the under 16 category at the Pacific School Games in Australia in 2017. Siddharth Pandey represented Maharashtra State Football Team in the under 17 category at the National Level, SGFI in Jammu in 2017. Yudi Luke was selected for a Basketball Training Camp at Rajanandgaon in Chhattisgarh and he represented Nashik at the Under 17 State Meet at Satara in May 2018.

Our Football Coach, Mr. Fergus Simmons was selected as the National Head Coach for the CBSE schools Under 17 football team that represented Maharashtra in Jammu.

PARENT TEACHER MEETS

The school places a lot of importance in maintaining cordial relationship with parents with extra care being provided to attend every individual issue brought for attention. The periodic PTM provides a platform for two-way communication between teachers and parents and affords a good opportunity to interact face to face on all issues concerning the progress of students. The Student's School Council of Ashoka Universal, Chandsi, was very impressive. They were well trained to organize and take charge of the entire event.

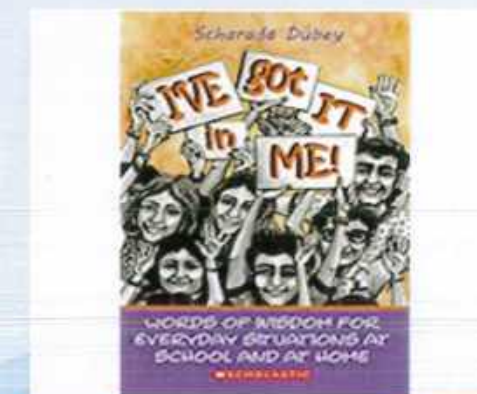
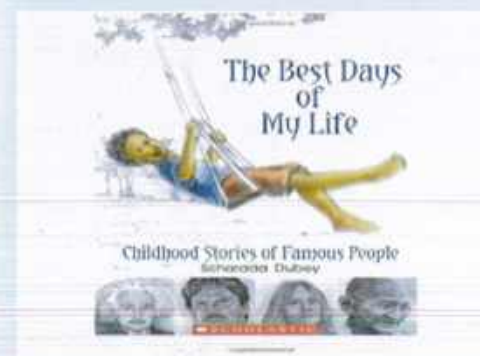
An Author's Visit to Barnes School & Jr. College, Devlali

It was indeed a mesmerizing event and it will remain etched in our minds for a long time.

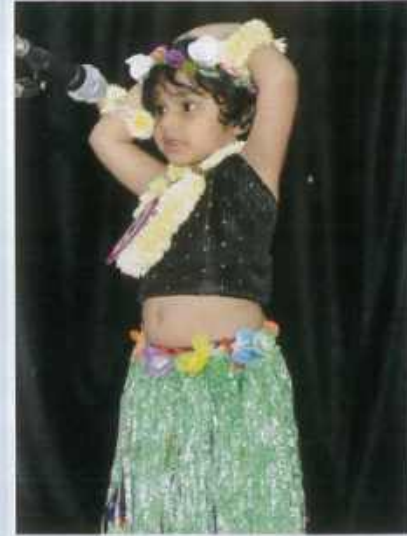

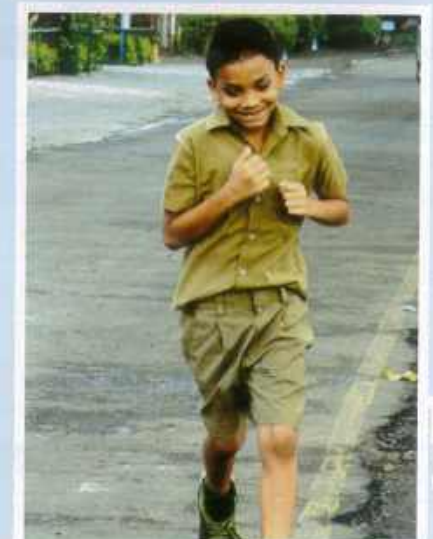
