- Three finalists, Tanmay Chavan of II B, Aira Kukreja of III C and Atharva Bhutada of IX B participated in an Art Olympiad "Small Hand Big Art" held by NDTV in collaboration with J.J. Institute of Applied Art, Mumbai and Rhode Island School of Design, US
- Sixteen students who participated in the International Indian Model of United Nations Organization held in April 2018 brought us honours and Rijak Kaur Sarla of VII B won the title of youngest delegate. Our school ranked 4th
- Many students who went in to the second level of the Science Olympiad Foundation in the National Level Science Talent search fared well.
- The Prefects' Investiture Ceremony for Junior

and Senior School was held on 22nd and 23rd of June respectively, while the Annual Prize Day was held on 30th of June.

- Forty-six of our students participated in IT Talent Hunt Test organized by Rotary Club and Anshul Papneja of Grade X was awarded the winner's trophy.

- All Twenty-nine prefects, accompanied by Mr. Deepak Rajput and Mrs. Charlotte Thopilwent for a full day outing to the City Center Mall.
- Roysten Mason & Ricky Cox of VIII A and Sana Khan of VII B were selected to represent Maharashtra in the Under-13 category of State Level Basketball Tournament.
- The Inter House Senior School Debate Competition was held on 27th of July (the motion was "Is Boarding School essential for Proper Upbringing of Child?")
- The school paid tribute to the martyrs of Kargil War on "Kargil Diwas" day
- At the Junior School English Elocution Competition, Mrs. Sheila Kuruvilla, the Academic Support and Mrs. Violet Thorpe, a former teacher of Barnes were judges for the same
- On 8th of August, Barnes School bid Mr. Julian Luke good bye as he moved on to greener pastures.
- Independence Day was celebrated by hoisting the tricolor. Students participated in a Peace March to Nashik to create awareness about Women and Child Safety
- On the occasion of Raksha Bandhan, 500 and more 'rakhis' were made by our Junior School students and sent to our soldiers on our borders.
- Four students and two staff members went to Finland and France on a Student Exchange Program in the month of August and September
- In the AISM Basketball Tournament our school's Basketball teams reached the Quarter

- In the Anglos Senior Football Team our school had to be content with the third position.
- Inter House Debate Competitions were also held for Senior and Middle Schools
- On 14th September, Dr. Diya Daulatani held a seminar on Young Girls' Health, Hygiene and safety for girls from Grade V to XII
- On 19th September a seminar was conducted for students of Grades X to XII about the Merchant Navy career option by Mr. Ketan Chakranarayan
- The Inter House Spell Well Competition for Junior School was held on 21st September and the Middle and Senior School Inter House Singing Competition on 27th September
- Two of our girls, Kellyann Davy and Aneeqa Jafry, were selected for the National Trials and the AISM National held in Odisha
- At the Inter House Cross Country Final on 28th of September, Candy House were declared the winners and Spence House the Runner-up for the boys and for girls Edith Cavell were the winners while Joan of Arc were the Runner-up
- Tata Class Edge provided a training session for all teachers from Grades I to XII on 29th September and Mrs. Monica Durgesh, Mr. Mario Gunnion and Miss Rekha Kasar were applauded for making effective use of the package in their classrooms
- A Counselling Session was held in the Learning Center for parents of Pre-Primary students where the Junior School Supervisor, Mrs. Leona Kingsellers, School Counsellor Mrs. Sampada Gadkari and Sister Paul, resident Nurse spoke about issue ranging from hygiene and vaccinations to intelligence and Emotional Quotient

Highlights (post Mr. Ainsley Edgar taking over as Principal of Barnes School & Junior College)

- On 2nd of November, Career Launcher conducted a seminar for our students, which was well accepted by all our students.
- Our students from the Art Department made Diwali Greeting Cards for the armed forces which was gratefully acknowledged by the Commandant of the Artillery Center.
- A Rangoli Competition was conducted just before the Diwali break and several students from the Middle School actively participated in it.
- On 14th of November, apart from an arousing Special Assembly conducted by teachers of our school, a Puppet Show was organized for the Primary and Pre-Primary students of our school and several other programs for middle and senior students of our school.
- On 16th of November, the Junior School Quiz Competition was conducted and the Blue House Team, consisting of Navya Boob (I B), Ethan Gardener (II B), Jaydeep Singh Sarla (III B) and Diya Patil (IV D), were the winners of the competition.
- On 24th of November, the 94th Annual Athletic Meet was conducted successfully and Royal House and Edith Cavell were the winners, with Balraj Singh and Alma Snowin being declared the Best Athletes. Major General Sanjay Sharma and his wife were the Chief Guests for this occasion and



commended the precision and smooth running of the event.

During the last week of November, we had our Alumni visiting our school for the Annual Reunion. Close to 150 former students visited. During the former students' reunion, a historical step was taken by inaugurating the School Archives in the Lloyd Block. This was established due to the indefatigable effort of our Chairman, Mr. Neil White and the hard work of Ms. Sona Sughand, the Communication Cell In charge. The Alumni thanked Mr. Vijaykumar Nair and Mrs. Judline Dinger for their long years of dedicated service and felicitated.

On 1st December, our school conducted its Annual Fete from 10:00 am to 6:00 pm, which was a complete draw as the food stalls were completely sold out before the carnival could come to an end. All staff and students helped in collecting funds for the institution that will go to improve the facilities.

On 10th December, in keeping with the municipality and its drive for the Measles-Rubella, a vaccination drive was conducted by the school which helped all students who had not been vaccinated earlier.

On 13th December, a Cleanliness Drive was conducted by our students in one of the neighboring villages through which the students gained their social and developmental skills for others.

In the English Olympiads conducted in General Knowledge, 23 students won medals.

The School Christmas Nativity Play "It's about the Cross" was held in the open quadrangle on the last day of the winter term. It was a play that was much commended as it was lovely to see a majority of students, from the tiny tots to the seniors, participating in the play.

After the function, the Christmas Party and Annual Dinner for staff were held with much fanfare and enjoyed by all and sundry.

The school celebrated the 70th Republic Day

with a meaningful March-Past and a tableau that depicted the seven North Eastern states. Despite inclement weather and temperatures falling below 10 degrees Celsius, parents turned out in large numbers to witness the function. Our tricolor was unfurled by yours truly. We were blessed to have the presence of Mr. Ronald White, President of the Bombay Education Society who sat throughout the function.

On 29th of January our school celebrated the 94th Founder's Day, during which, in a solemn ceremony, the Principal made a key note address on how a school was blessed to have a history of over 200 years behind us and to have humbly began as tiny school in the Bombay Fort area, within the premises of St. Thomas's Cathedral. The function was also graced by Mr. Ronald White, the President of the Bombay Education Society.

The Junior School Sports Day was conducted on February 9th and was largely attended by parents, well-wishers of our school. Mrs. Edgar was the Chief Guest for the occasion and congratulated the students for the colorful physical education displayed and novelty sports that were conducted.

The Science Working Model Exhibition was held in the month of February, where students of Grades V to IX built working models with waste material from day to day life and demonstrated to the public how science can be demonstrated through everyday activities. Students from Army Public School attended the exhibition and appreciated the project display and the way they were explained. Apart from the science exhibition dedicated based itself to cyber science and which demonstrated new technologies in mobile applications and cyber safety measures in online transactions.

In the month of March we were happy to learn that one of our former students, Vice Admiral Karambir Singh has been selected by Government of India as the Chief of Naval Staff from 1st of June.



In a letter to the school, he has commended the teaching and the lifestyle he received in Barnes. A copy of his letter to the school has been shared with parents in an earlier circular.

#### Workshops

Since I took over in October, to a very great extent, the workshops conducted for the development of the teachers have been based on teacher's improvement and self-identification of the hallmark of a good teacher. Once this was embedded, we moved to class room teaching and how to conduct good lessons so that observations of lessons is positive and strong and observers find more of learning and less of teaching in the classrooms. This has helped the teachers to make students collaborate and innovate. Many students have become good independent learners. The teachers ensure that students are taught more through doing activity based lessons rather than rote learning. How to overcome poor performance of students and how to prepare.

Mrs. Sampada Gadkari, Counsellor, conducted several workshops for staff, students and parents:

- She conducted a workshop for all school teachers and other staff on "Mindfulness"
  - On 29th November, she discussed and conducted a workshop on "sexual behaviour of children in changing socio cultural environment"
  - Sexual Harassment at work place .
  - A seminar on dealing with peer pressure among girls for Grade X students
  - A separate session for girls and boys was conducted by her for growing up changes
  - Very effective workshop was conducted for students of Grades V to VIII, on bullying
- Mr. Clisson D'Silva, Consultant, conducted several workshops for the support staff. He discussed about grooming and hygiene and food handling, as well as housekeeping and personal hygiene. For the security, he discussed about entrance, exit and lobby security as well as patrolling.

#### ICSE and ISC results

The ICSE and ISC examinations began from February 22nd, 2019 and teachers worked non-stop with the students to ensure that they bring in good results, which they did. I am happy to inform you that the ICSE and ISC results have been one of the best that the school has had till now. Apart from all 113 students of ICSE and all 33 students in ISC passing with flying colours. Sakhi Mishra stood first with 572 marks overall whereas Anshul Papneja stood first with 96 %, out of the best five subjects and Ashish Thakur stood third with 94.16 %.

I am happy to inform you the following students scored above 90 % apart from Anshul Papneja, Sakhi Mishra and Ashish Thakur:

Tiya Das, Sarthak Chaudhari, Abhishekh Nisal, Pulkit Singla, Mohit Chawla, Yash Patil, Bhakti Kukreja, Utkarsh Mishra, Anushka Jadhav, Joel Varghese , Atharva Bhutada, Diya Modi, Mrudula Gholap and Aprurva Karanjkar.

In ISC Grade XII, Om Shah stood first with a total of 94.25 % in best of four subject and Karan Rughwani stood second with 93.75 %, Himansi Kewlani stood third with 92.25 %. Navin Kalal and Fiza Ahmad scored 92 %, Himanshu Sharma scored 91.25 % and Harshwardhan Ragade scored 91.50 %.

I am happy to inform you that Himanshu Sharma scored 100 % in Physical Education in the ISC Examination, while Manish Jaiswar scored 100 % in Physical Education in the ICSE Examination. In the Grade X ICSE Examination, Anshul Papneja, Ashish Thakur, Pulkit Singla and Tiya Das secured 100 out of 100 in Computer Science. Sakhi Mishra scored 100 % in History.

We thank the teachers who taught these students. Mr. Kiran Waghulkar for Computer Applications, Mrs. Monica Durgesh for History, Mr. Toufiq Khan and Mr. Fergus Simmons for Physical Education.

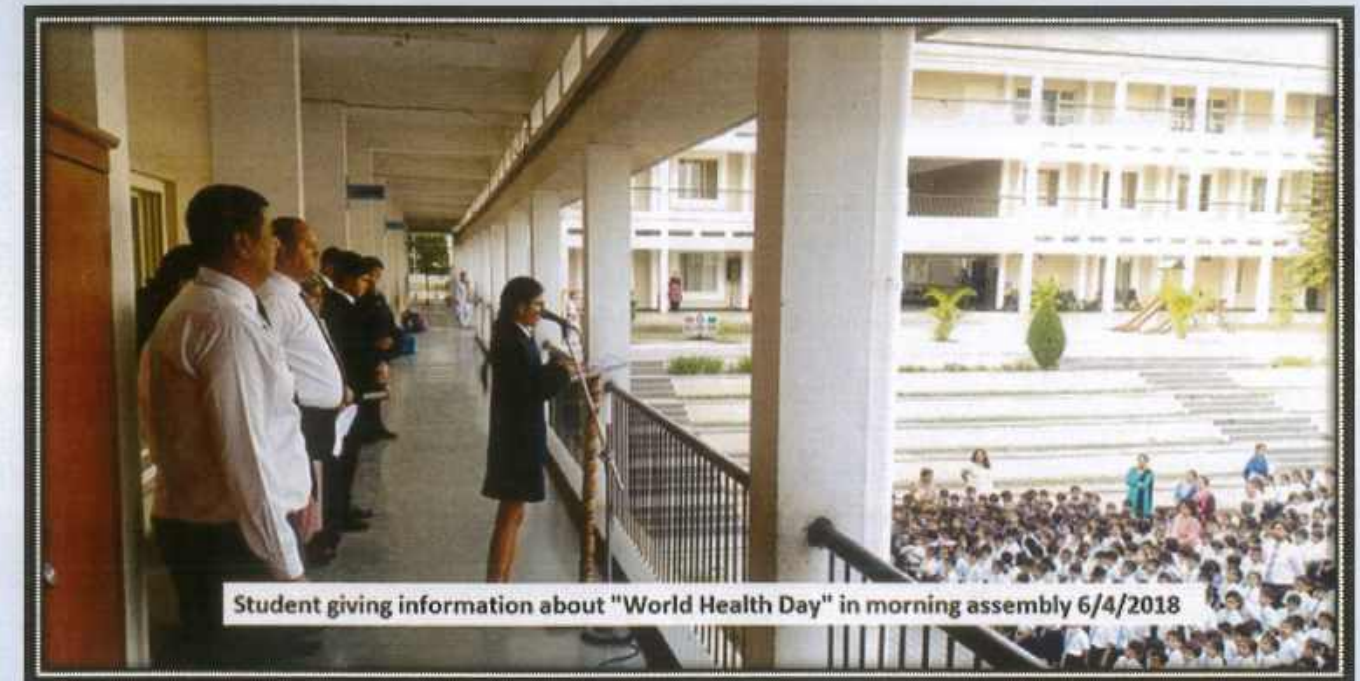

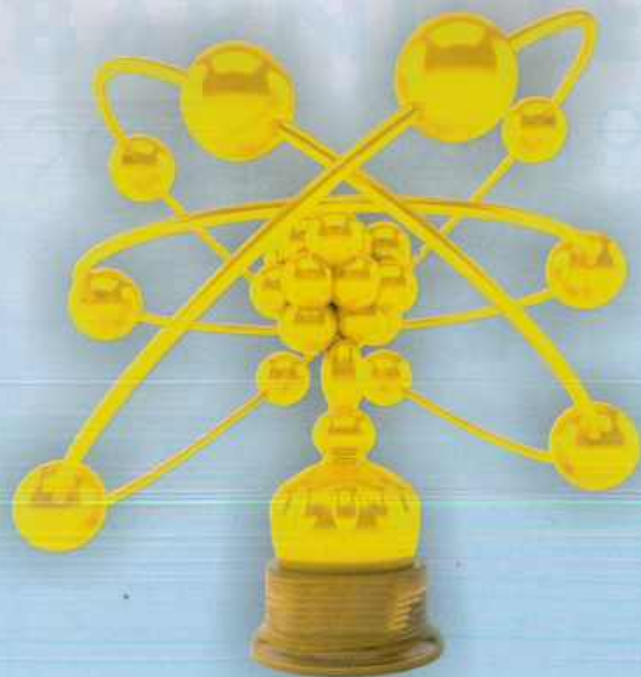

## Defensive Driving Techniques Training for Barnes School and Junior College Students

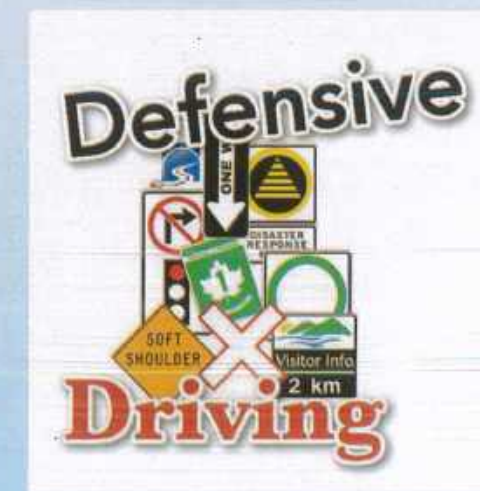
July 12, 2018

The criteria the judges were looking for were neatness, effort, presentation and material used. This brought an end to the awesome competition.



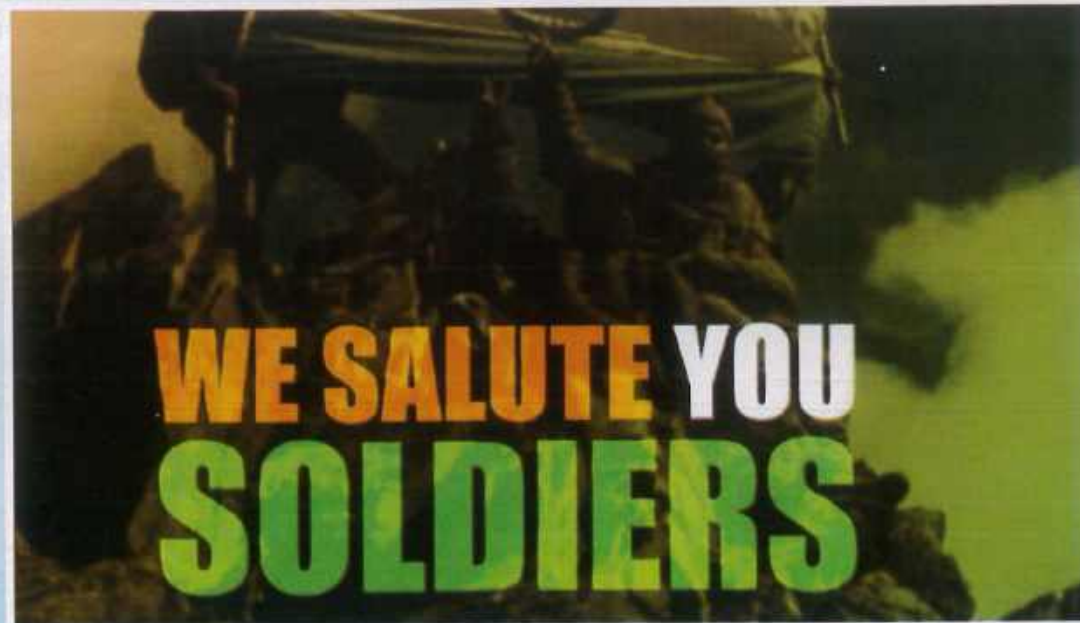
## Kargil Vijay Diwas

The Open Day came to an end with the conclusion that the progress of the students depends on the joint effort of parents and teachers.

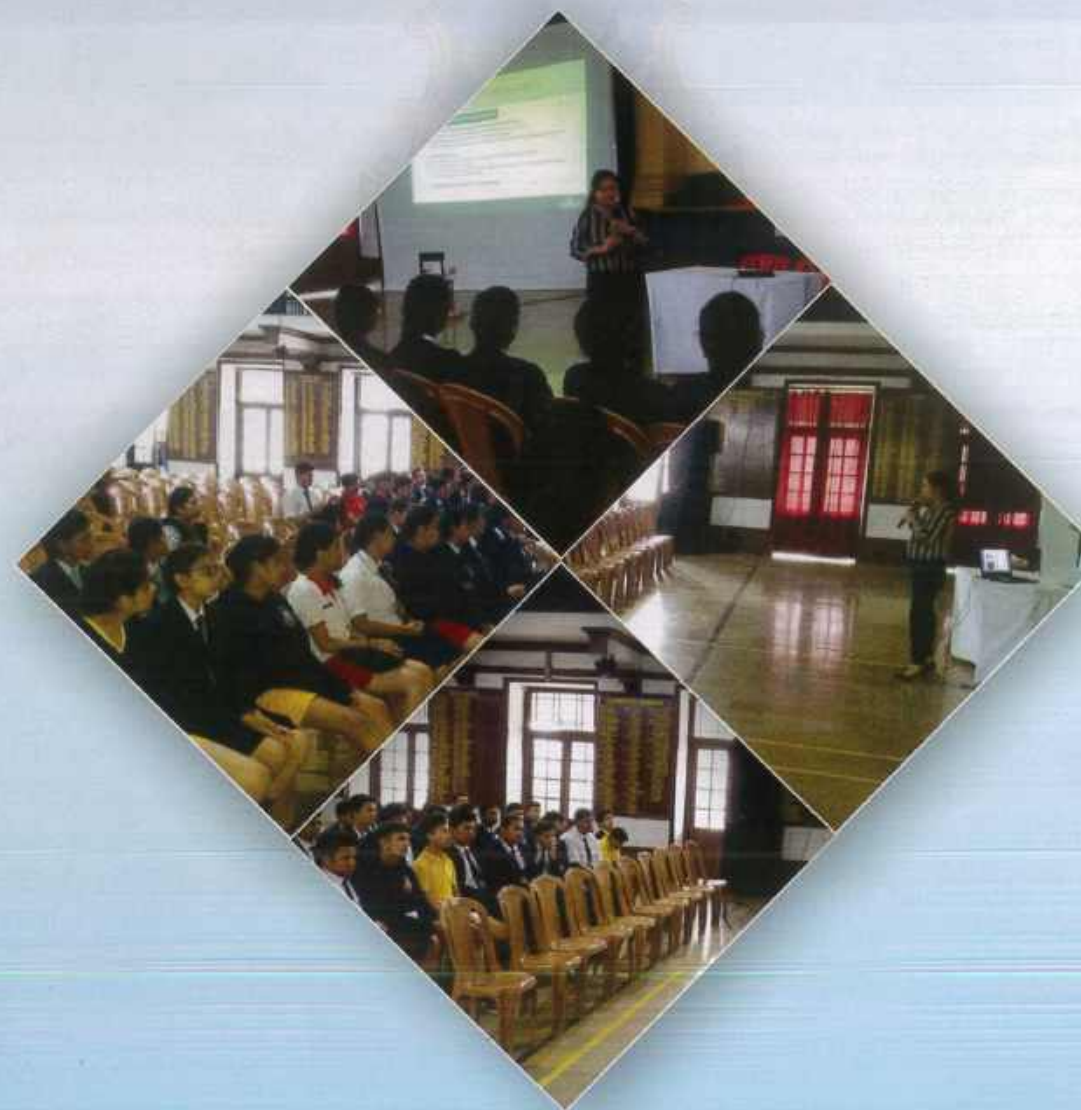


## Seminar on Study Abroad

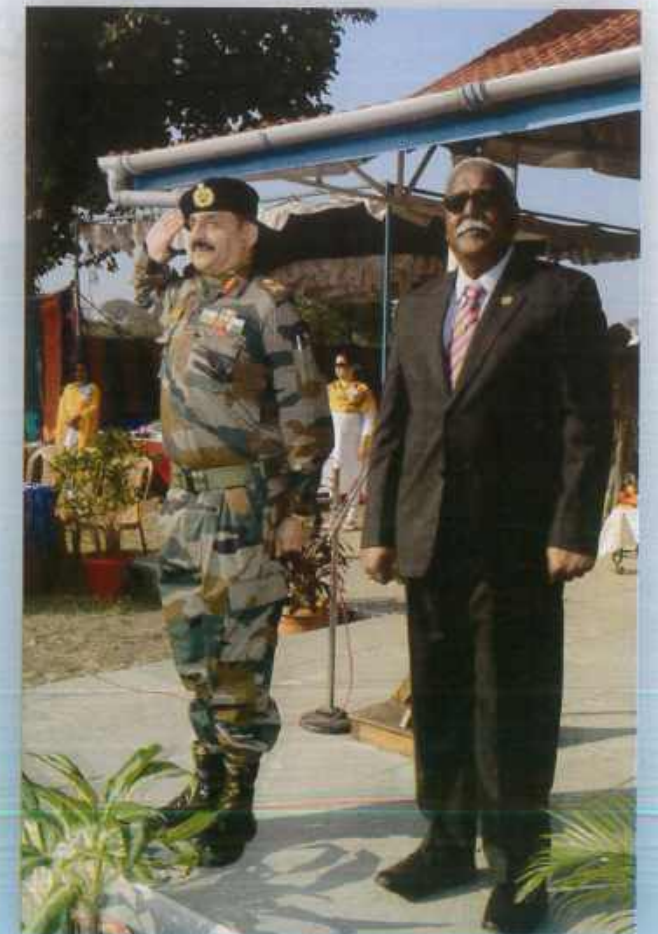

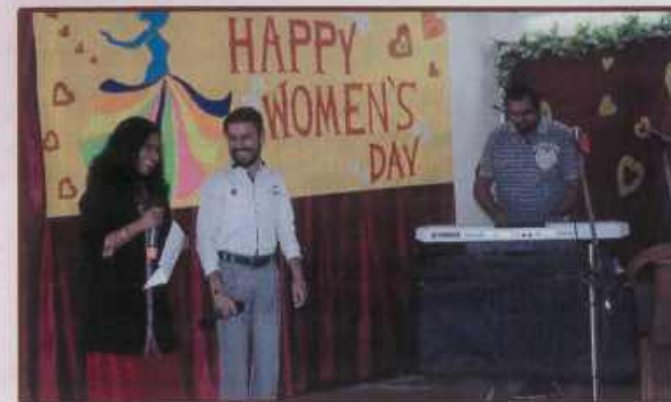

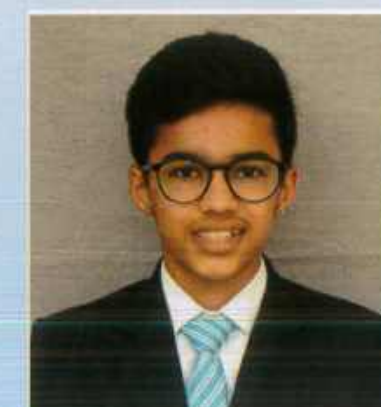
# 19 medals for Science & 2 for Art Olympiad

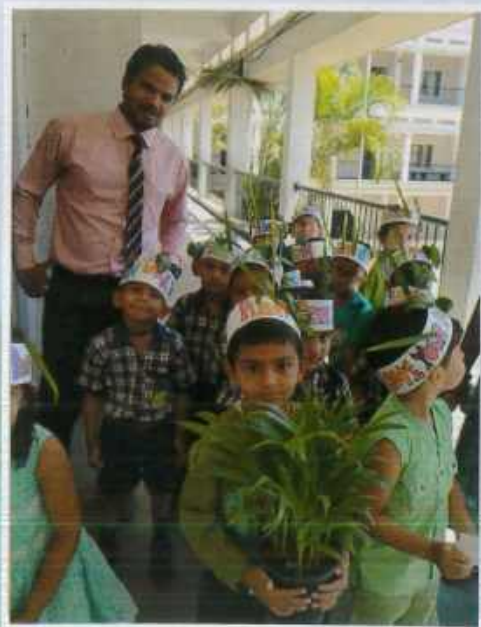

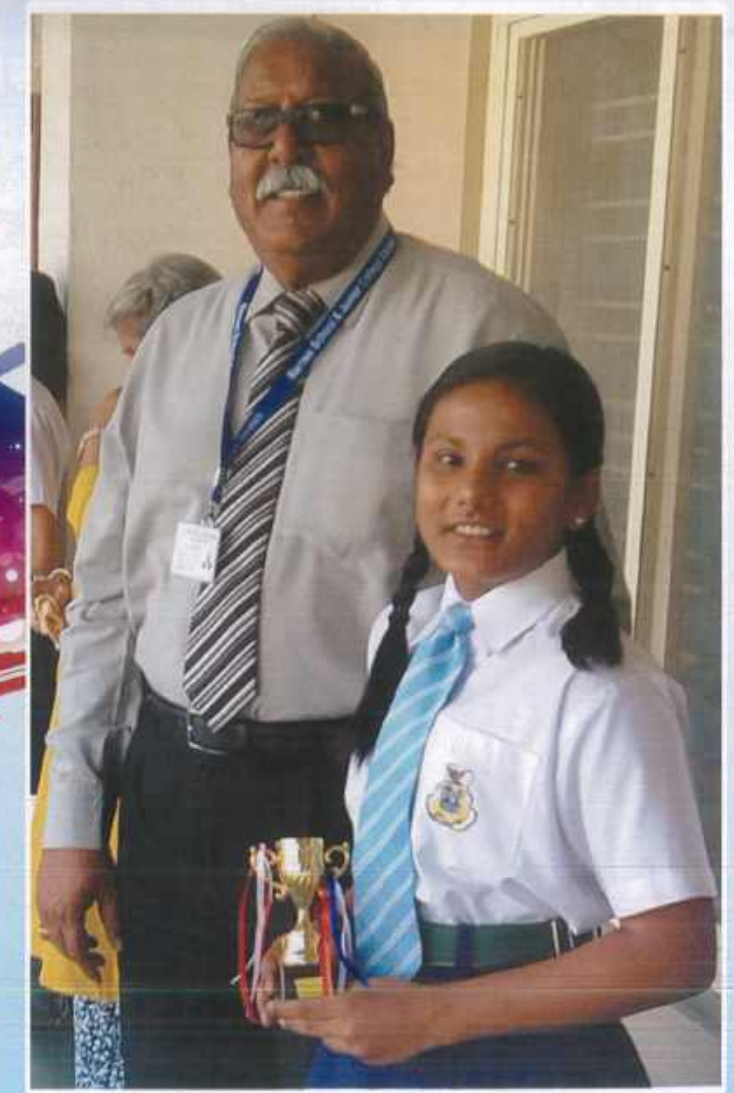
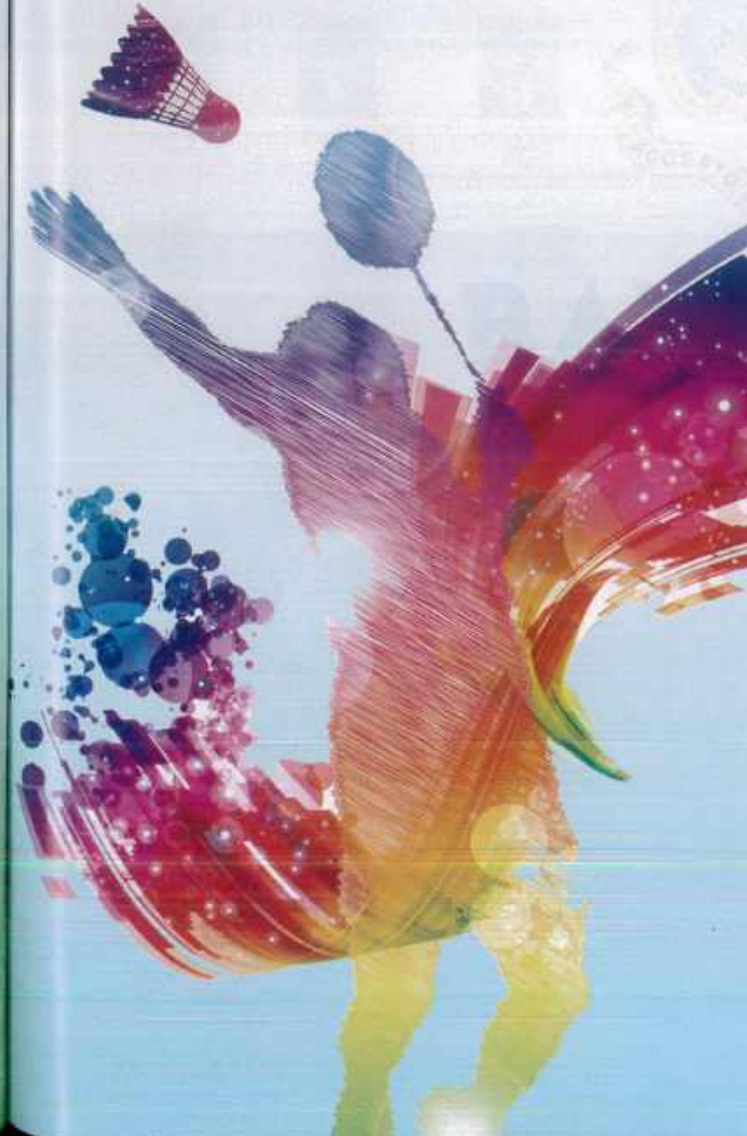

Barnes on the Top

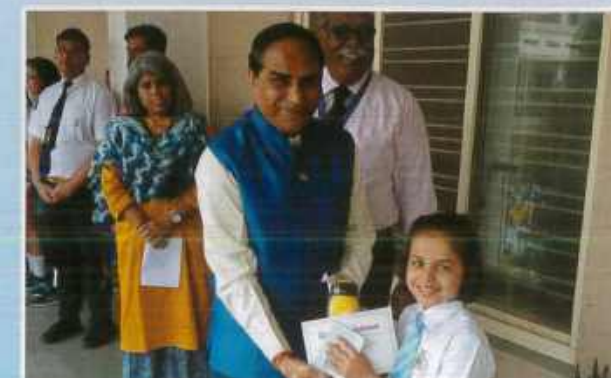

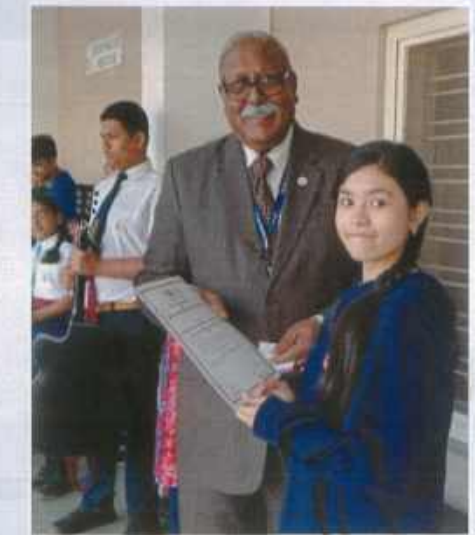
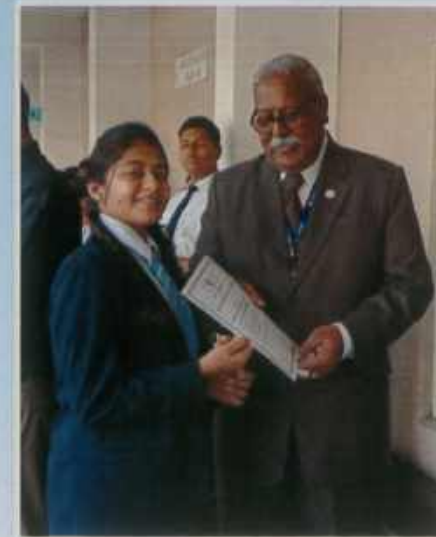


## Europe Meets India
