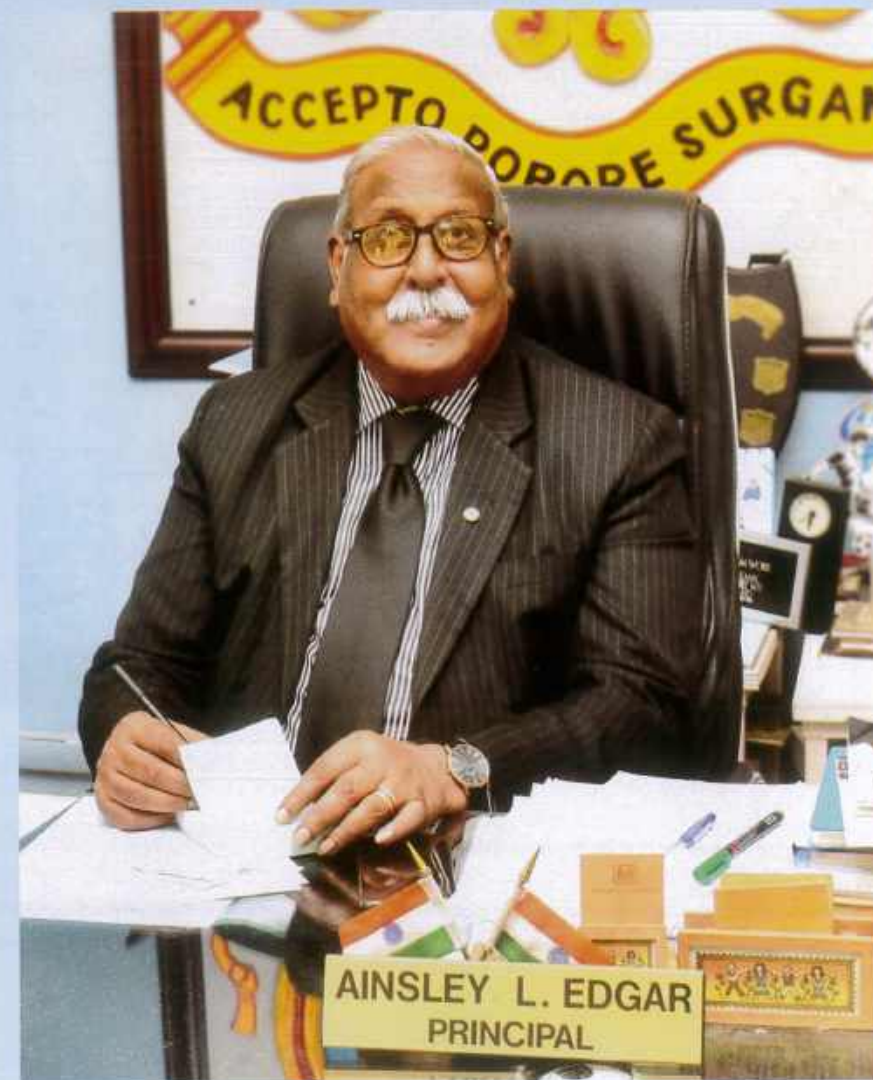

I welcome you to Barnes School & Junior College's latest edition of its school magazine that telescopes the happenings and achievements of our children and school which has a rare distinction of serving thousands of students that have passed out of its portals since 1925.

Since 1925, Barnes has created a legacy of a safe and vibrant learning environment and ranks among the few much sought-after boarding schools.

The trajectory of growth from its original humble beginnings in the British Port of St. George, old Bombay and in the shelter and shadow of St. Thomas's Cathedral, subsequently moving to Byculla and operating from Christ Church School, as one school till finally the British Government allotted the 265 acres in Devlali, on which the four majestic stone buildings, namely, Haig Brown, Lloyd Block, the Spence Block and Candy Block were constructed.

Today, the school is safely spaced between the School of Artillery and the South Devlali Air Force Station.

The school has a rich tradition of Air Force and Army children passing out with flying colours and receiving quality education for interim periods during their father's posting in Devlali.

Barnes has the distinction of being the first school in Nasik to be completely empowered by solar energy.

Sculpted in our co-values of "Onward Barnes, Upward Barnes", alumni have created a niche for themselves in every conceivable field and today are spread across countries of the globe.

As a school, we work closely and collaboratively with our parents and provide holistic education to our students, equipping them with knowledge and the skills they need to go out with into the practical world, with enthusiasm and confidence.

This edition of the Barnicle focuses on two calendar years of school life, i.e. from April 2019 through March 2021. This period, unfortunately, encloses one of the darkest periods that the school children of Barnes have faced, as academic activities were halted, but gave the school an opportunity, on 25th March 2020, to restructure the teaching and learning system through online lessons.

It was a quick transition to the online mode, always optimistic that schools would go offline soon. To our shock and disappointment, this only happened for a short while from January 2021 to March 2021, during which period the school managed to have regular classes, conducted the final examinations partially and scheduled as many activities as possible and permissible, as it was essential that we prepare our children for the new world.

The huge spaces that Barnes is blessed with have presented Barnes with many advantages. It was possible to conduct regular classes for this period due to us having the massive dormitories based in Spence and Candy, so making it practically possible to maintain social distancing in these buildings and at the same time reuse them effectively once again. It was also one of the major contributing factors towards Barnes not having a single boarder contracting Covid as our boarding section continued to flourish during much of the pandemic period.

Despite the lockdown, the school continued to produce unprecedented results in driving improvements in the quality of education delivered with the implementation of effective policies and procedures. This helped us in motivating and improving school advancement in the given circumstances and creating value for all the stakeholders.

While going through this magazine, you will find two years' ICSE & ISC results basically for the period when board examinations were hardly held or not held at all.

We have included all that was possible to be conducted during these very difficult times, thereby ensuring that our students do not lose out drastically during the pandemic period.

I wish you all happy reading and look forward to better times and regular offline school operations in the very near future.

I'll be failing in my duty if I did not thank our parents for their constant active support in every possible way and most of all in understanding the challenges Barnes faces as a school.

The judges Mr Jadhav, Miss R Bagalkot Mrs. Madhuri were overwhelmed with the handiwork of the students.



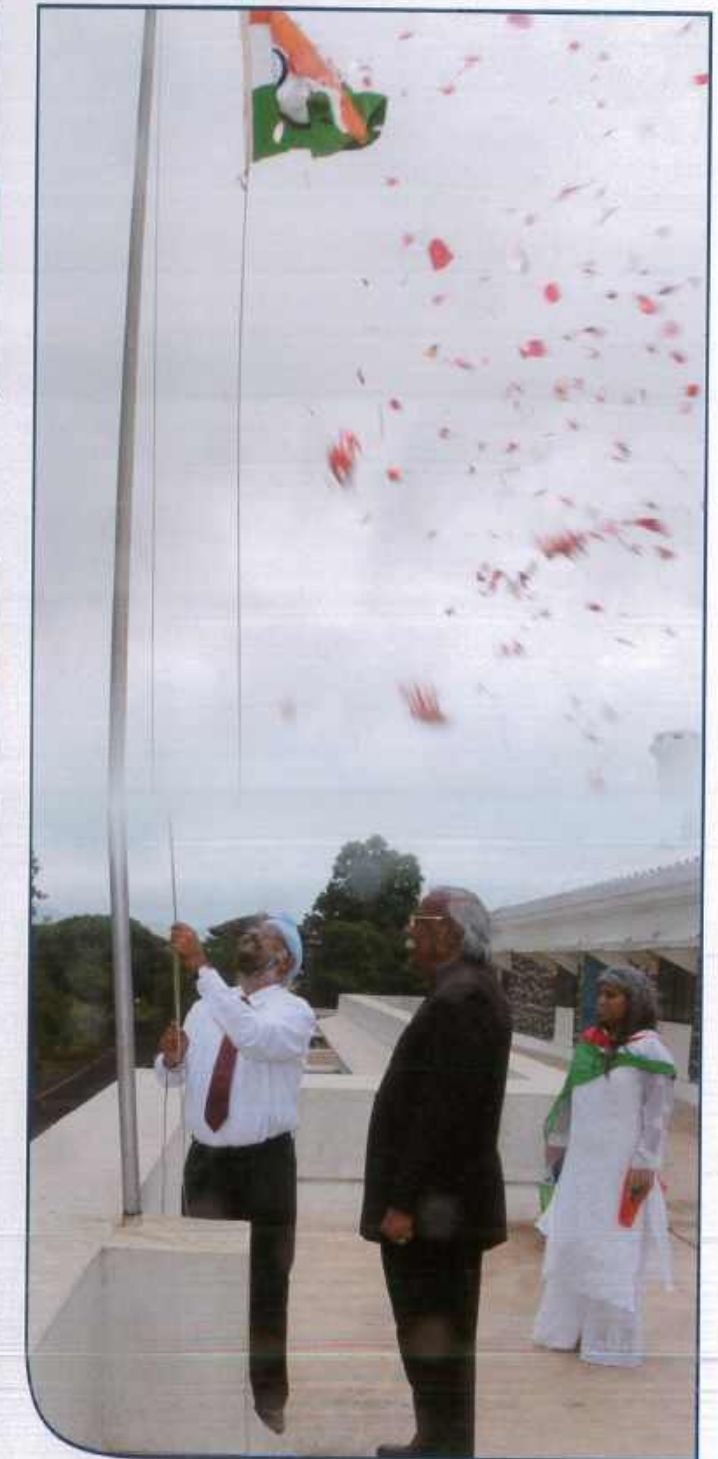
FRUIT SALAD DAY

Hindi Elocution held at Barnes School & Junior College. Our students beat their stage fright and narrated beautiful poems and stories for their fellow students.





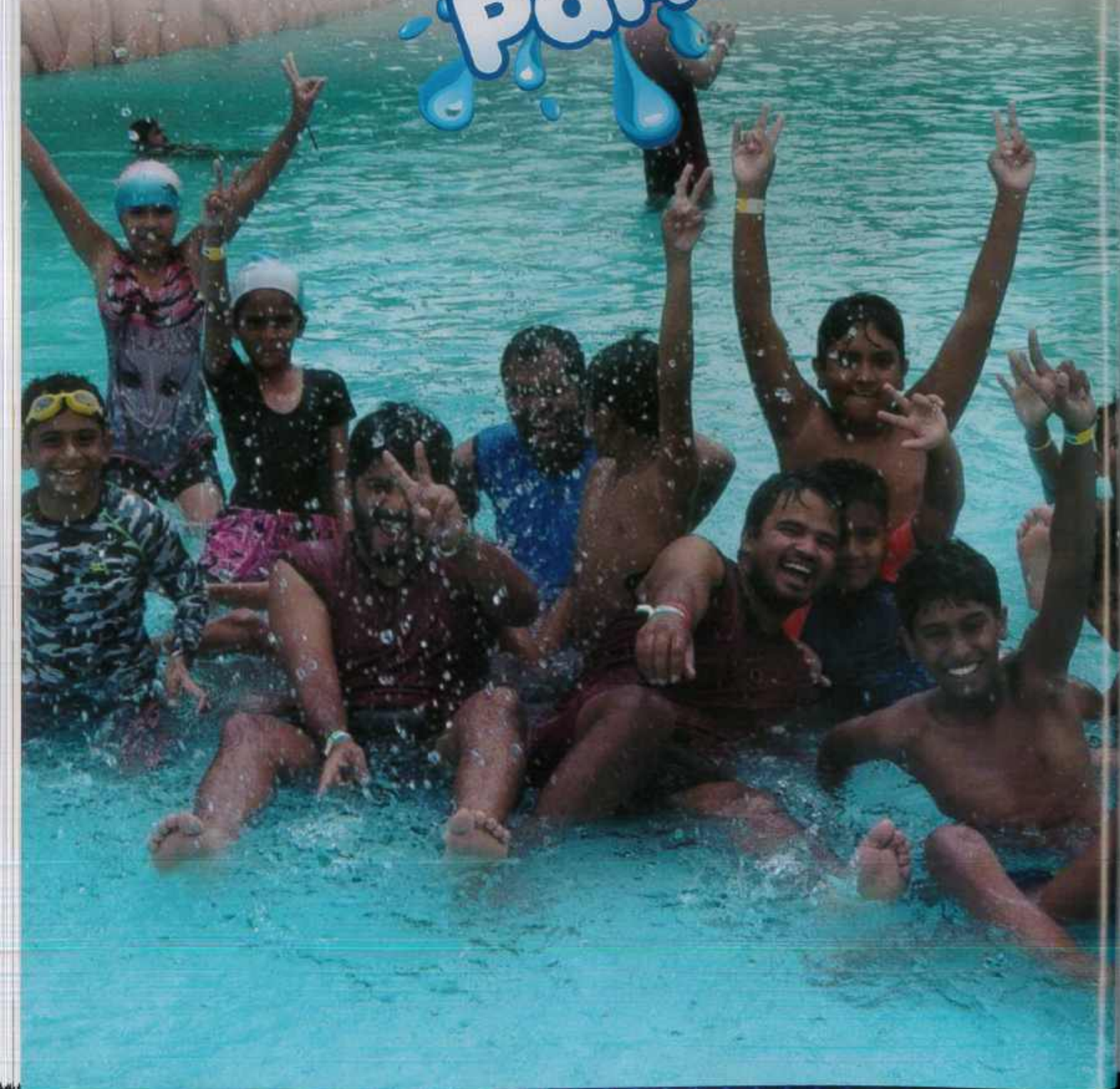

The Best speaker Vansh Rughvani from Grade 8C.

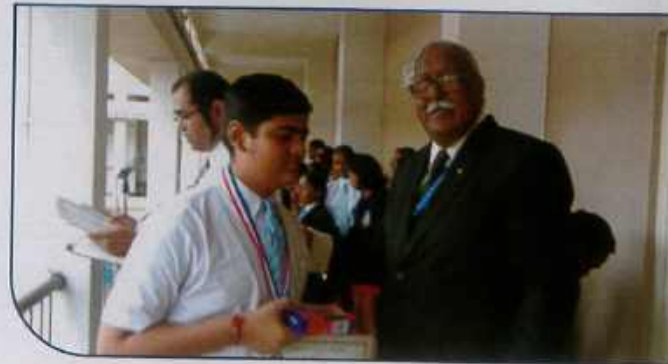

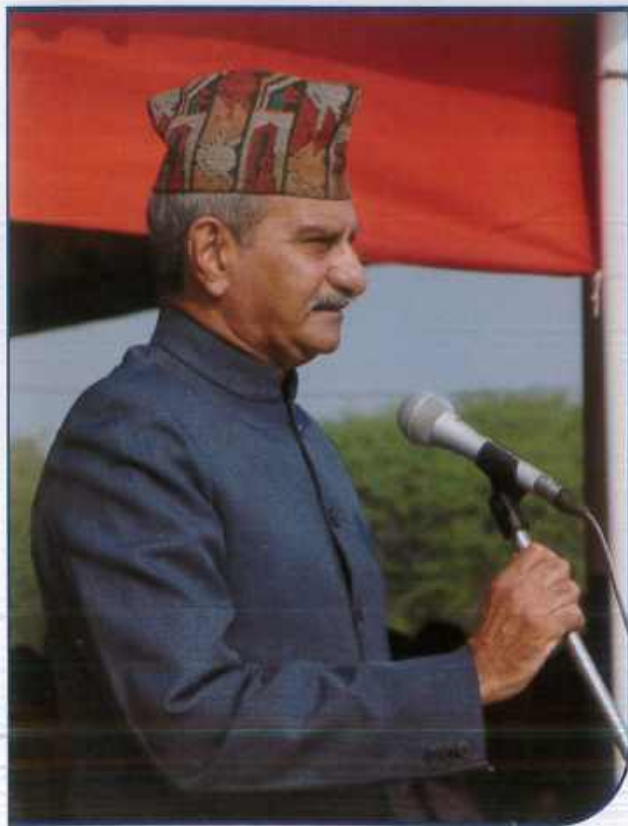
THE 95TH ANNUAL ATHLETIC MEET

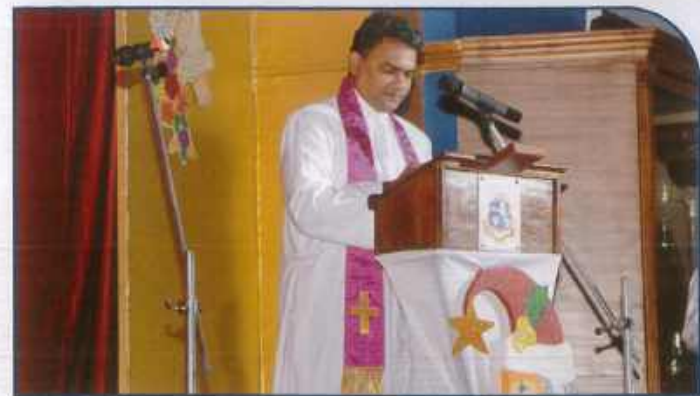

It was an exciting event leading to the Red House as the winners of the competition. A video clip on 'Spelling Bee' was also shown to the audience after the competition.

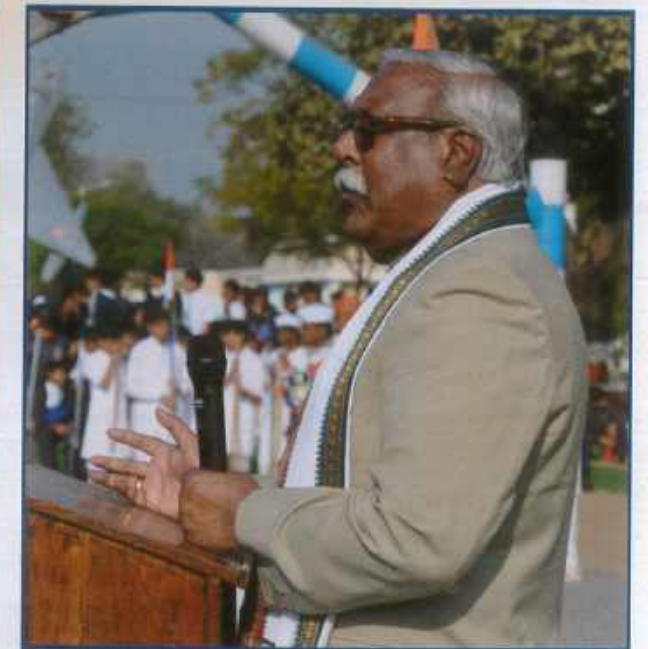




REPUBLIC DAY

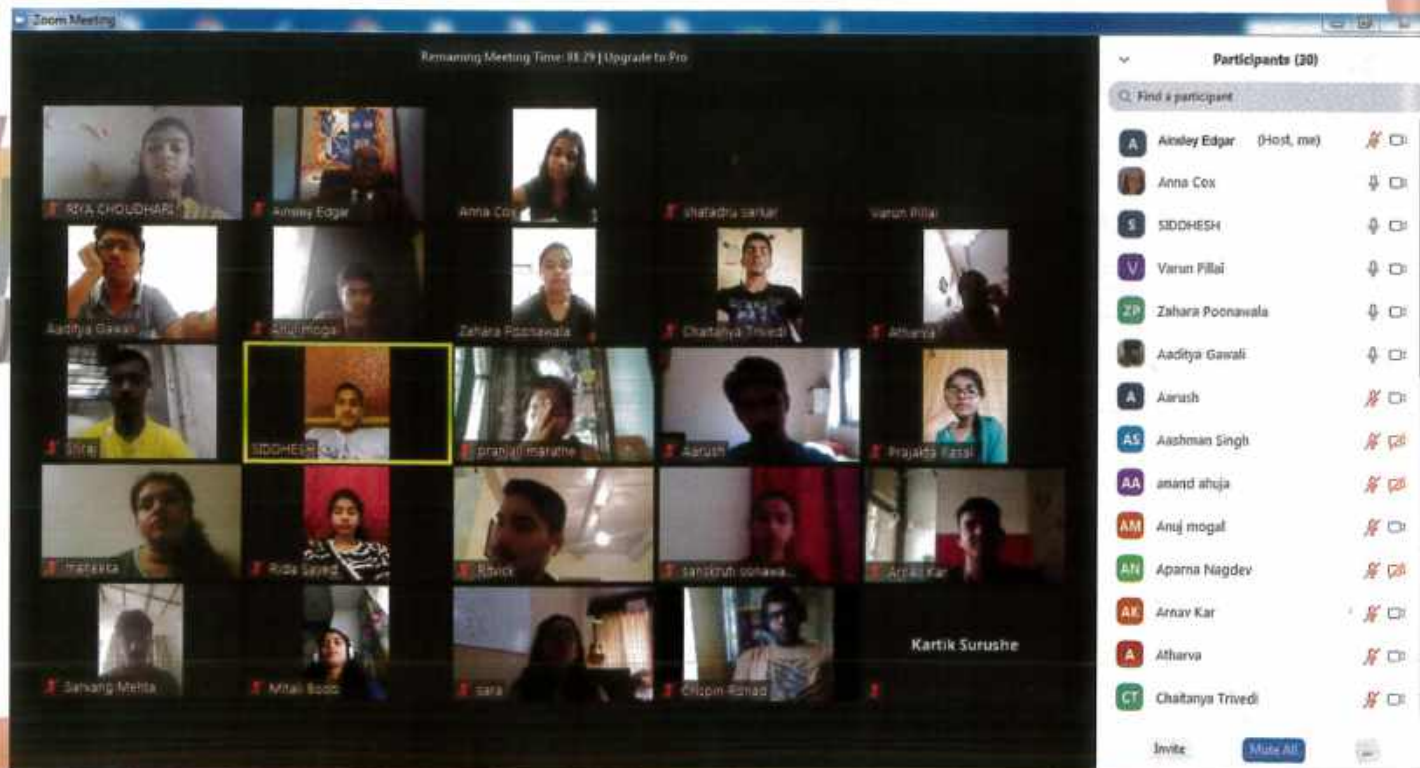
Inauguration of online classes for Grade XI

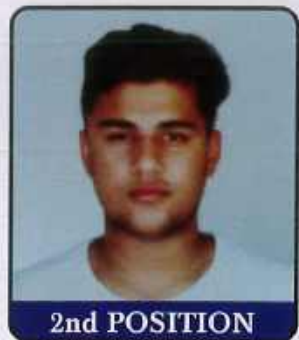

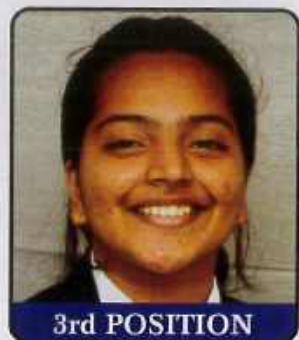

BOARD RESULTS 2020 -21

Barnes School & Junior College has scored 100% results in both the ISC Grade XII & ICSE Grade X and examinations once again.

Grade XII ISC

THE 72nd REPUBLIC DAY



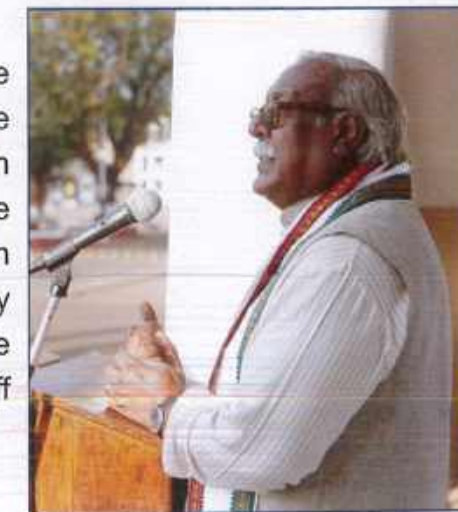
The 72nd Republic Day – 26th January 2021

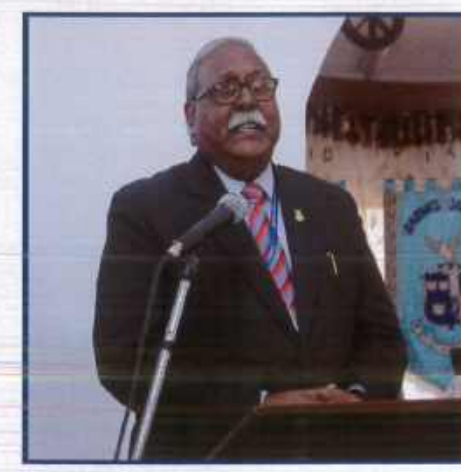

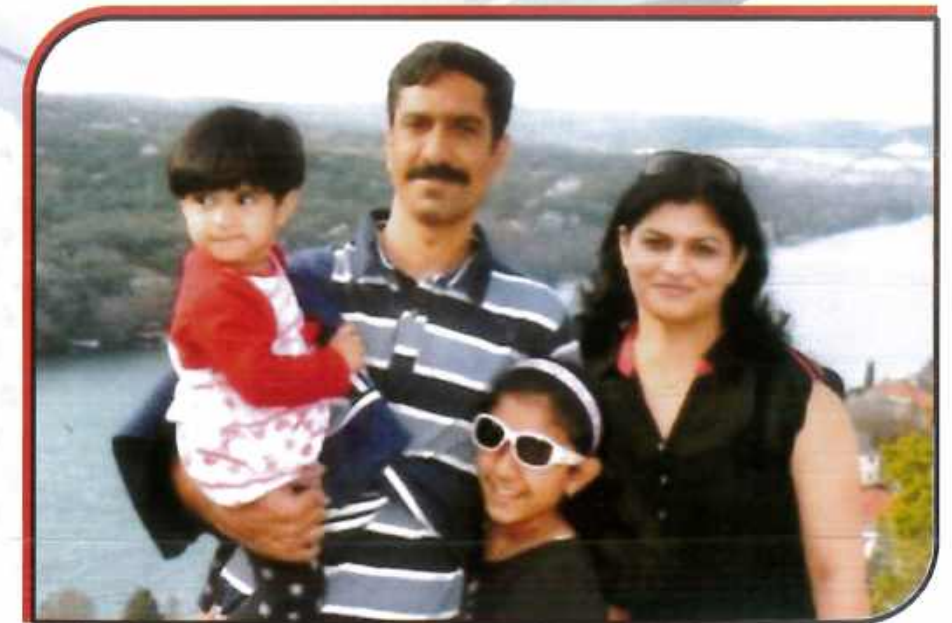
