The 92nd **Annual Prize Day** Saturday, 1st July 2017, at 5:30 pm

Dear Parents, Guardians, Students & Members of Staff,

A very Good Evening to you all.

It is my pleasure to welcome you to The 92nd Annual Prize Day Ceremony of Barnes School & Junior College. I take this opportunity to express our gratitude to Major General & Mrs. Roy Joseph who graciously accepted our invitation to be the Chief Guests for this evening.

The academic session of 2016-17 began with a sad note as we lost one of our most revered teachers, Mr. Michael Thorpe, on 11th April 2016. A stalwart who had dedicated the most intense years of his life in the service of Barnes and the field of education.

Thomas Campbell, the Scottish poet felt that to live in hearts we leave behind is not to die. That appears so true when we get to see the profound effect of teachers of the likes of Mr. Thorpe and Mr. Gadre, who passed away on 17th August 2016, on the lives that they touched and the consistency and grace with which they empowered students through their remarkable teaching, values of honour and the pursuit of excellence.

Moving on to our school events, the school continued to witness some activity even during the summer break with the Football Summer Camp from 1st May to 20th May 2016 attracting quite a few football enthusiasts who made good use of some basic football training skills.

The reopening of school post the summer break presented a flurry of events with the Junior School and Senior School Prefects' Investitures just around the corner, followed by the Senior School Debates on 22nd June 2016.

Martin Luther King Jr. in his "I have a Dream" speech used the language that lifted up an entire nation. Words that showed people what was possible. Words that painted a gorgeous picture of the future. Mrs. Shayonti Talwar, Assistant Professor, Gokhale Education Society, Nasik, in almost identical fashion, conducted an interactive seminar on language proficiency for our students on 22nd June 2016.

The Junior College Students, along with a few of our Members of Staff visited the Gowardhan Cheese Factory, Mancher, Pune, on 2nd July 2016, as part of an educational tour promoted by Penguin Holidays Pvt. Ltd.

Close on the heels of the Hindi Elocution Competition on 4th July were the Middle School Inter House Debates on 11th July 2016. The senior students of Classes IX, X, XI & XII travelled to Mumbai, the girls to Jankidevi Public School while the boys to Champion School for participation in the Frank Anthony Memorial Inter School Debates Competition on 15th July 2016.

The 2nd Barnes Invitational Football & Basketball Tournament on 8th July & 9th July had two outstation teams from Christ Church School, Mumbai & St. Peter's School, Panchgani, joining the local teams from Ashoka Universal School, Delhi Public School, St. Xavier's School and a host of other reputed schools across Nasik.

Christ Church School, Mumbai, emerged the winners of the Boys' Under 14 Football Tournament as they beat Orchid International School, Nasik. The Boys' Under 17 Football Team of Barnes School beat the St. Xavier's, Nasik team, 3 - 0, to clinch the trophy. The girls Basketball teams of Barnes School and Wisdom High International were declared joint winners since the Basketball Final had to be called off due to the heavy rains.

The Inter House Singing Competition on 16th July was followed in quick succession by the Albert Barrow Memorial Inter School Creative Writing Competition on 18th July 2016.

The Inter House One Act Play Competition in July 2016 gave our students the rarest of opportunities to get to live somebody else's life and to see the world through a different pair of eyes.

The blend of co-curricular activities and sports continued throughout the monsoons via the Cross Country on 23rd July, our participation in the Subroto Mukerjee Football Tournament in August, the Middle and Senior School Inter House English Elocution Competition on 2nd August, the visit of The Bishop's School, Kalyaninagar, Football Team for a friendly fixture on 6th August and the Inter School Taluka Level Football Gramin Tournament on 8th and 9th August 2016.

Students of Ashoka International Centre for Educational Studies and Research began their Internship programme of 3 months from Barnes in August 2016. It was an extension of our contribution to help prepare creative, globally conscious and locally proactive educators.

The Junior School Tree Plantation drive on 12th August and a friendly but fiercely competitive football match with our ex-students on 14th August were among other memorable events.

The Government of India, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Department of School Education and Literacy, New Delhi, initiated the celebration of freedom fortnight from 9th to 23rd August, titled "Azadi 70 - Yaad Karo Qurbani". It was a historic moment as we requested visiting Football & Basketball Teams who were visiting Barnes for the All Maharashtra Anglo Indian Tournament to assemble at the lower Football Field for mass singing of the National Anthem at 10:30 am on 23rd August 2016.

The prestigious All Maharashtra Anglo Indian Football trophy continued to remain in our possession as we beat The Bishop's School, Camp, Pune for the second year in a row with a score of 2 - 1 in the final. The honours of academics and sports were equally shared as, almost at the same moment, Education World, the human development magazine came up with its #1 day-cum-boarding school in Maharashtra ranking for Barnes for the third consecutive year.

Perhaps, one of the most notable events was the Barnes girls' football team that travelled to Christ Church School, Mumbai for the zonal match of the All Maharashtra Anglo-Indian Schools in India, (Maharashtra Chapter) Football Tournament for Girls (U-12). The practice sessions of the

Under 12 girls just a few days prior to the tournament were heartwarming and delightful to watch.

Last year's Teacher's Day celebrations were carried out on Saturday, 3rd September since the 5th of September happened to coincide with the auspicious occasion of Ganesh Stapna. While our members of staff took off for an excursion to Rain Forest Resort, Igatpuri, the students of Nutan Vidyamandir found Barnes to be the ideal location for a picnic and had a memorable Teacher's Day outing.

A dream-team combination of the school football team, a few ex-students and the coach, Mr. Furgus Simmons, participated in an open Football Tournament at Shikrewadi, Nasik Road, and came back with the trophy and a cash prize in September.

The Bishop's School, Camp, Pune, had the misfortune of having to face the Barnes boys' football team once again in the final of the 8th Steven Anderson Memorial Inter School Football Tournament. Trying their level best to get even for the recent loss during the Anglo Indian Tournament, the Bishop's boys couldn't get the better of the Barnes footballers as they lost 4 - 2 in the penalty shootout even though our boys played the entire second half with a player short.

The Junior School English Elocution Competition was held on 16th September 2016. The same day, two of our senior school students, accompanied by a member of staff, travelled to Lilavatibai Podar High School, Mumbai, for participation in the Ignited Minds Inter School Debates.

The Barnes football team continued to consistently bring laurels to the school with the Under 19 team qualifying for state level football for the third year in a row. They extended their winning streak by beating the Boys' High School Football Team 3 - 1 in the final of the Alfresco Football Tournament held at Allahabad in October. Apart from sports, the students also excelled in other activities with a second spot in the "Sur Sangam" & "Jingles" competitions and 3rd position in the "Zentangle" contest

Bollywood star, Arshad Warsi, an ex-student of Barnes added that extra bit of charm to the Ex-Students' Reunion from 24th to 27th November and turned the occasion into an unforgettable part of last year's highlights.

December witnessed the Junior School Sports Day, the Senior School Annual Athletic Meet, the Nativity Play and the school did not lose its flow of students even during the winter break with the camp set up by members of the New Life Movement from 27th to 31st December 2016.

The students of Class IX were introduced to a "growing up" session by Psychiatrist, Dr. Karegaonkar upon their return to the school after the winter break in January 2017.

The Republic Day celebrations were followed by the Founder's Day, which was celebrated on 28th January. Mr. Kaisar Dopaishi, Principal of Singapore International School, Mumbai, and an ex-student of Barnes made the occasion special by graciously accepting our request to be the Chief Guest.

The Annual School Fete on 4th February 2017 had its usual joyful and nostalgic moments and was soon followed by an innovative Science Exhibition on 11th February which highlighted the

team effort of students of the middle and senior school.

The allotment of 25 Junior Division seats and the beginning of the NCC training course from 6th February 2017 was a much awaited dream come true.

On 28th February, 2017, Christ Church School, Mumbai, lost its Principal, Mr. Carl Laurie. A man of impeccable standards who always led by example, with clarity, stability and extreme loyalty. Working alongside him was equivalent to going through life with a safety net.

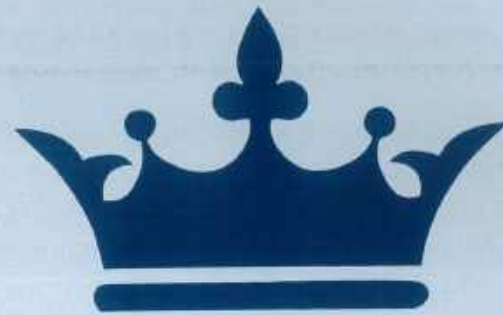
The Academic Year 2016-17 has been a testing period for all of us right till the very end with the "not-too-promising" Class X and XII results. It has been a season of more lows than highs.

The teachers of Junior School lent their support throughout to make this event a grand success.

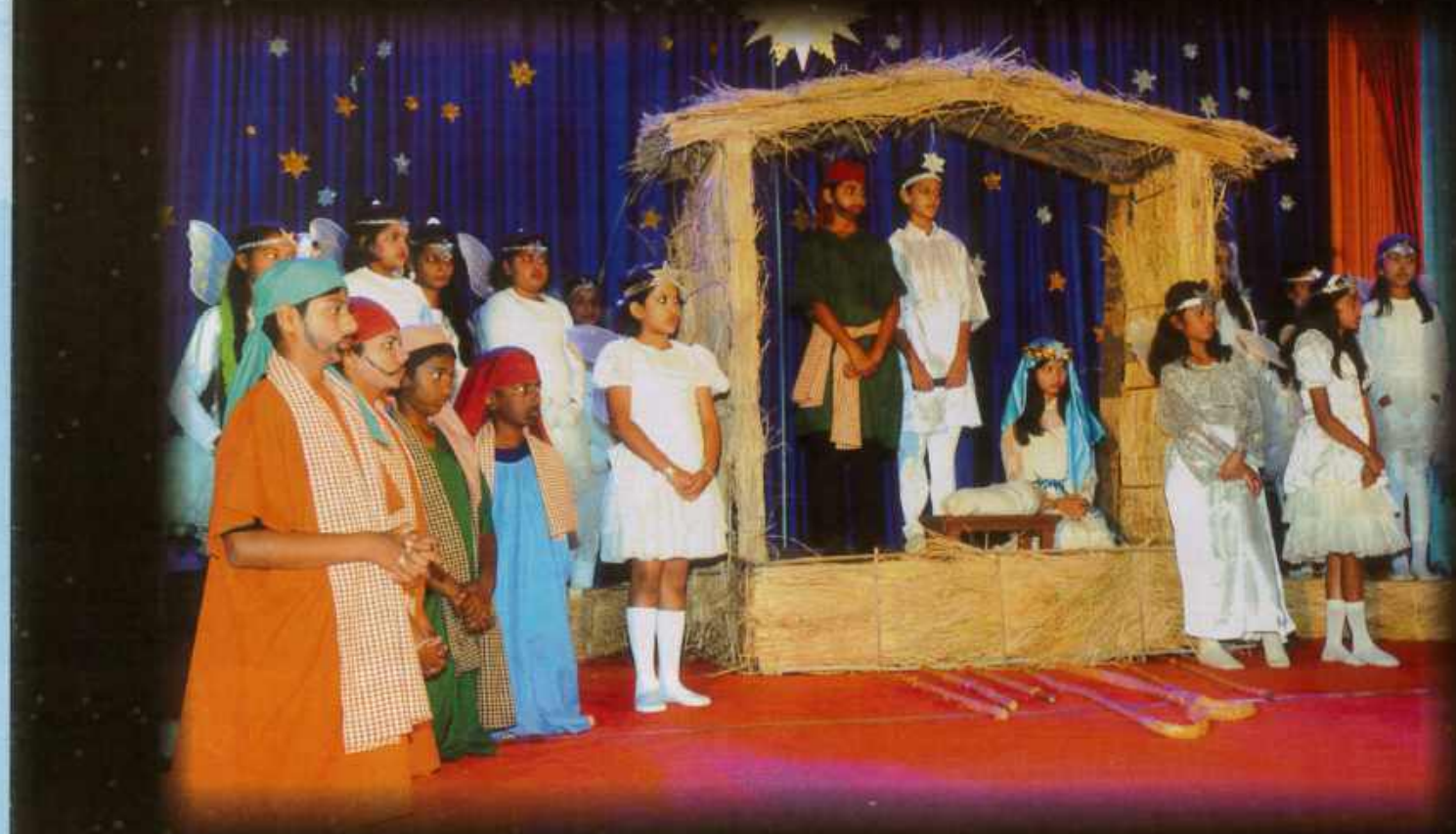
